Notes for guidance for candidates for admission

1. Candidates may complete and submit the form either by post or email
2. Occupation - please enter here the title you wish to be used in the City Records e.g. Instrument Maker, Scientist, Chartered Engineer....
3. Candidates must meet one or more of the following criteria
 - be directly concerned with the making of scientific instruments
 - be scientifically qualified and/or skilled in the use of scientific instruments
 - be able to satisfy the Court that they are directly concerned with the craft of scientific instrumentation
4. If not already a Freeman of the City of London you will need to become one by firstly getting a certificate of membership from the Clerk and secondly applying to the Chamberlains Court – visit the City of London web site [here](#) for more details.
5. All candidates are required to provide a copy of their birth certificate - the 'long' version for British births or equivalent for other nationalities. For naturalised British subjects a copy of naturalisation papers will be required.
6. Candidates must be aware that they are expected to remain Liverymen for life and that the financial implications are:
 - **All Liverymen** must pay the appropriate quarterage (membership subscription) **annually** and are expected to make an **annual** charitable donation of at least £75.

- **New Liverymen** must also pay an Admission Fine of £500 (this may be paid in four equal annual instalments). They must also pay £60 for a livery badge.
 - **Freemen** of the company whom we have known for at least five years, who have had a suitable career development and are Free of the City of London may become Liverymen without having to pay the Admission Fine. On becoming a Liveryman you will however need to pay £60 for your Livery badge.
 - The Clerk will issue quarterage notices for each new Livery year commencing October. All members are required to pay their quarterage within 30 days.
7. Proposers are not required if you are already a member of the Company

*The Court may change these amounts from time to time as it deems appropriate.
